Job Purpose

To promote the values of Malahat Nation through collecting environmental data and observing and reporting on the various industrial, commercial and recreational uses of the Salish Sea.

Under the Supervision of the Executive Director of Environment and Sustainable Development, and in collaboration with other members of the Malahat Environment team, the successful applicant will assist with developing and operating the Malahat Marine Monitoring and Stewardship Program. With increasing recreational, commercial and industrial activity in the Salish Sea, Malahat Nation is prioritizing protection of the important cultural and environmental resources that are a part of Malahat Nation’s territory. The successful applicant will be responsible for data collection, marine monitoring, safe boating practices, and finding creative solutions to unique challenges. Malahat Nation has been dedicated to protecting and understanding these ecosystems since time immemorial and must be a part of building the understanding required to manage these valuable resources effectively.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Participate in monitoring programs such as shoreline erosion, underwater noise and ship source pollution, and crab and prawn surveys
- Promote safety while working on commercial vessels
- Work efficiently with other programs at Malahat Nation
- Help create a nurturing learning environment for other members of the team
- Maintain an open and positive attitude towards Coast Salish/Malahat culture and history
- Promote teamwork and good work ethic
- Participate in training and staff meetings as required
- Other duties as required
